





 RALEIGH: currently considering a <u>12% starting</u> salary increase for police officers

DURHAM: Last year gave police 4% Raise,
<u>city workers only 2%.</u> While this year it's proposed 10.6% increase for Police recruits.






Police have killed 7 People in North Carolina So far in 2022

Police killings per 1 million people in the U.S., 2013–2022




Populations via 2020 Census data
